### **Saturday Evening Panel Stalking the Myths that Heal**

When a culture or religion has a healthy myth it is capable of containing the archetypes and images that hold the group together. The word “myth” gets a bad rap when it is translated as something “untrue.” But here we are talking about something much deeper – the myth that is a container for non-historical truth. Reb Zalman teaches that “theologians talk about ideas, but myths are transformative.” Old myths that once were functional can now be toxic within a religion or culture. Reb Zalman, Ibrahim Baba, and Father Morgan Silbaugh will each take an honest, self-critical look within their own faith traditions. They will share with us the myths that are no longer working within their respective faiths. More important, they will each take a look at the emerging myths, metaphors, and archetypes that can bring planetary healing in the emerging paradigm.
